



Toolkit for Ending Long-Term Homelessness at www.csh.org/toolkit

The Corporation for Supportive Housing's website, www.csh.org, now features an interactive resource to help communities across the country in their work to end long-term homelessness. Particularly of value to supportive housing service providers and developers, the Toolkit for Ending Long-Term Homelessness highlights the most promising practices for serving people who have been homeless for months and years on end. Components of the toolkit include:

- Profiles of supportive housing programs and projects across the country that are successfully housing people who have been homeless for the long term;
- Interactive photo tours of eight of these projects, showcasing good design and service programs;
- Sample documents from each of the programs profiled, such as leases and memorandums of understanding; and
- A full list of additional resources, many of them available online.

The projects represented range in size from five units to over 75 units and are located in California, Connecticut, Illinois, Kentucky, Minnesota, New York, and Oregon. Special areas of focus include:

- Gaining community acceptance;
- Employment programs for tenants;
- Eviction prevention;
- Local financing of supportive housing;
- Physical design;
- Rural housing;
- Services and property management integration; and
- Tenant education.
